SCHOLARSHIPS/BURSARIES/AWARDS

We have tried to compile a comprehensive--but admittedly not exhaustive*--list of awards available to our students. As we become aware of other awards or revisions to the conditions attached to the awards herein, we will publish them. It is the students' responsibility **to listen to the announcements and periodically check with the guidance counsellor** for updated information that may pertain to them.

1. Many application forms are not available yet. When and if they arrive we will announce them. Listen to all P.A. announcements, read the printed announcements every day . A copy of the daily announcements will be posted.
2. You should note that some awards application forms have to be requested directly by you, i.e. you have to ask the institution or organization to send you an application form.
3. If you have questions about the contents of this awards brochure, please direct them to your counsellor.

* The universities and colleges have awards departments that may be consulted regarding other special financial prizes available to first-year students. Your parents, relatives, or grandparents may be an employee or member of an organization that gives awards or bursaries which you may be eligible to access. **Ask them!** If you work part time, your employer may have an award which you may be able to access.

When reading this document, please keep the following broad definitions in mind:

- a) **Scholarship** - an award of money given to a person with high academic standing. Qualifications and accomplishments will usually have secondary importance.
- b) **Bursary** - the main criterion is usually “financial need”. You and/or your parents may be asked to share information related to family income and resources.

- c) **Awards** - the criteria may be a combination of a variety of areas such as academic excellence, need, and school and community involvement.

Please note:

3. Students who defer their studies for one year will need to apply by the early deadline date (usually Feb. or March) and submit a transcript of final grades. If you have attended another university or a Bible College since graduation, you should be in touch with the Awards Office to determine whether you could be considered for a scholarship.
4. Scholarship Finder is a comprehensive database of Canadian Scholarships. It is a free service that may be accessed through the Internet address: www.schoolfinder.com or call 1-800-211-5577.
5. As a first-year university or college student, as well as in subsequent years, be sure to visit the awards office to apply for general and specific awards offered. There will be several.
6. When applying to any college or university, check what they offer for scholarships.
7. Government loans website: www.studentaid.gov.mb.ca.
8. It will be necessary to give **at least one week's notice** to anyone from whom you are asking for a scholarship reference. Please be mindful of deadlines.

TIME DEADLINES

Some of these dates will require minor adjustment from year to year.

TYPES OF AWARDS

- Deadlines** - award applications must be submitted before certain dates. If it's a mailed-in application, allow adequate time for delivery.
- LOANS** - must be repaid after graduation from university (or discontinuance of studies), including interest.
- BURSARIES** - based on financial need; do not have to be repaid.
- SCHOLARSHIPS** - based on academic or personal abilities; do not have to be repaid.
- PRIZE** - certificates, medals, plaques, etc. given in recognition of excellent performance.

CANADA STUDENT LOANS AND MANITOBA STUDENT LOANS

The Manitoba Student Financial Assistance Program provides financial assistance for educational purposes to Manitobans with limited financial resources. The awards are intended to supplement, not replace immediate family resources. Students are expected to contribute their resources towards educational costs. There is a maximum amount of assistance that may be received, and not all students receive maximum funding, since awards are based on financial need.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- be a Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident
- be a Manitoba resident
- take at least 60% of a normal course load in an academic year
- study at an approved institution
- study in an approved program that is at least 12 weeks in duration
- have an assessed financial need

TYPES OF ASSISTANCE:

The Manitoba Student Financial Assistance Program administers the Canada Student Loans Program (CSLP) on behalf of the Federal

Government. Needs of up to \$350 per week are met with funds cost-shared between the federal and provincial governments. An additional \$40 per week is available for students who are eligible for Manitoba Study Assistance, for a total maximum of \$390 per week. Anyone considering a loan is asked to check out a Manitoba Student Aid package from the S.C.I. counselling office or check the website:

www.studentaid.gov.mb.ca. Also note that the amount parents are asked to contribute has been reduced. Now students from families with income up to \$80,000 may also be eligible to receive some aid.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Applications may be obtained from the S.C.I. counselling office (after May 15th), or from the Manitoba Student Aid Program, 409 – 1181 Portage Avenue, Winnipeg, Manitoba R3G 0T3. (945-6321) or call toll-free in Manitoba (not including Winnipeg) 1-800-204-1685. When an application is submitted, both Canada Student Loans and Manitoba Student Loans are included. Students whose needs exceed the maximum may be eligible for consideration for Manitoba Study Assistance as well. If this is the case, a form will be sent to the applicant.

Application for loans and bursaries must be received as early as possible to be processed before classes start in September. It may take six weeks to process an application, provided it is complete and includes all required documentation. Applying on-line is much quicker so please note these special instructions when the forms come in during the month of May. Incomplete or missing information can cause a six- to eight- week delay. If help to complete the application is required, contact the Manitoba Student Aid Program in person or by telephone.

CANADA ACCESS GRANT

An up-front grant from the Canadian Government is available to families who have qualified for the Child Benefit Income Tax Supplement. Check with www.studentaid.gov.mb.ca This grant is up to a maximum \$3000 or the student's assessed need.

Calvin Christian Collegiate Scholarships and Awards 2016

Every award has its own criteria and method of submission. In general submit all materials to Mr. Jeninga as early as possible and he will see to it that it is forwarded to the proper people. The “student applies directly” usually means that a brief essay describing one’s eligibility is required. This, in some cases, means a specific application form is required but in many cases a typed essay is all that is required. The “selected by staff” means that the student does not need to do anything except be sure that the school is aware of their future plans so that s/he is given proper consideration. If the student decides very late or does not divulge what they are planning to do then the school staff might not give them full consideration.

1. Christian Leadership Scholarship 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$500.00

This award is for a student who shows exceptional leadership qualities and above average academic accomplishments. Our desire is to encourage young adults to nurture and develop their leadership gifts in Christian service. Scholarship to be given upon proof of acceptance into a program/service opportunity (of at least 3 months duration) focused on training Christian leaders. The award is confirmed as in effect until the fall of 2013.

Applicant(s) to write a 500 (approx) word essay explaining past examples of leadership taken, and future desires to continue growing in this gift.

2. Irwin Homes Business Scholarship 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$250.00

Criteria: A hardworking individual, able to accomplish goals, and show leadership and vision specifically related to business. Scholarship received with proof of acceptance into a business program at an accredited university or college. Valid until September 2011.

Applicant(s) to write a 300-500 word essay that demonstrates their hard work ethic, leadership and accomplishment of goals. This is to be done using examples as they relate specifically to business. As well, briefly explain plans after graduation as they relate to the scholarship.

3. Chown Centennial Scholarship 2016 (selected by school staff)

Amount: \$500

This award is a \$500 tuition offset. The U of M sends us the material in early June. We select the top graduating student going to the U of M (and an alternate), submit the paper work to the university and they will subtract \$500 for the student's tuition account. The student gets a form letter with their name on it presented to them at graduation so that they can prove, at the admissions office, that they are legitimate.

Criteria: minimum average of 85% based on at least five credits at the S4 level.

-attendance at the U of M in September for a full (100%) study program

-additional criteria may be established by each school

-candidate is nominated by school staff

-no application necessary

4. Epsilon Creations Short term Missions Scholarship. 2016
(student applies directly)

Amount: \$250

Criteria: short term mission project in a 3rd world country

-can be with a church or an organization

-heart for helping others

-valid for the calendar year immediately following graduation

Applicant(s) to write a brief letter expressing their desires regarding the short term mission experience and a brief explanation of how they came to this choice. As well, include a bit of information on the organization (if applicable) you are going with.

5. The Alice Besant Memorial Scholarship 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$500

The student must be entering University 1 and pursuing a university education in the Health Care field. The student must be entering university in the fall immediately following their high school graduation. To qualify, the student must have a minimum overall average of 80%. The graduate must be enrolled as a fulltime university student with minimum of 24 credit hours. (12 of these must include chemistry and biology)

The application will consist of a brief summary should be included explaining their career intentions in the health care field. We would also like them to include a summary of their other interests and activities. Please provide us with the students essays, and final grades of all classes when it is time for the selection. Proof of registration as a fulltime student is required along with confirmation of course selections. In the event that more than one student qualifies, the student with the highest overall average will receive the scholarship.

6. 4L Communications Music Scholarship 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$500

The applicant must be pursuing a music major/minor in post-secondary education at a university or college of their choice.

This education must begin in the fall immediately following their graduation.

The applicant(s) is to submit a brief explanation of their future aspirations in this field.

7. 4L Communications Missions Scholarship 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$500

The intent for this award is to support a student who is going on a short or long term mission service. The service can be local or cross-cultural. The applicant must be going sometime within the first calendar year after graduation.

Applicant(s) to give a brief history of the mission they will be going with, what they will be doing in the time that they spend there, and what their goals and desires are for this experience.

8. 4L Communications Camp Scholarship 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$500

This scholarship goes to the individual working 6-8 weeks at a camp the summer immediately following their graduation and then going on to some kind of post-secondary education in the fall.

9. Norma Robson Memorial Bursary Fund 2016

Amount: \$500

Please see Mr. Jeninga for specifics regarding eligibility criteria.

10. Principal's Award 2016 (selected by school staff)

Amount: \$500

The Principal's Award is presented to the student who graduates with a high academic standing. Further, and more importantly, the recipient is one who personifies the spirit of their respective high school.

11. Vickar Community Chevrolet Scholarship 2016 (selected by school staff)

Amount: \$500

The purpose of this award is to recognize deserving graduating students who will be pursuing their studies at the post-secondary level at a community or vocational college anywhere in North America. The recipient must have demonstrated good character and an excellent work ethic. In addition, the student must have displayed initiative and/or leadership qualities.

Proof of registration at an approved institute is required.

12. Wyatt Dowling Insurance Brokers Scholarship 2016 (selected by school staff)

Amount: \$250

The purpose of this award is to recognize deserving graduating students who will be pursuing their studies at a recognized university or college in Manitoba, in the field of Commerce or Business Administration. Once again, the recipient must have demonstrated good character and an excellent work ethic. In addition, the student must have displayed initiative and/or leadership qualities.

13. John Harris Award 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$ (Various)

The donor of the fund that supports this award is partial towards attendance at a Christian post-secondary college demonstrating a reformed world and life theology. The student applies for this award and must demonstrate that he/she understands what is meant by a Christian commitment as it applies to life and college life. Several references must support the application.

14. Providence College 2016 (student applies directly)

Amount: \$750 (\$500 scholarship + \$250 for residence)

For the years up to and including June 2010 this award was termed a 'Leadership Scholarship' and was for \$1000/yr for every year the student attended Providence College. Beginning with the graduating class of June 2011 the award is changed to a bursary and will be for \$750 for the first year only.

(Note: This is an annual award which has two primary intentions: 1) to promote enrolment in the Leadership and Management run by the Springs College, as well as, 2) to encourage work in the area of special needs.)

This award is for a student who wishes to enrol in the Leadership and Management course offered by Springs College. This specific course challenges young people to use their leadership skills within God's kingdom and offers opportunities to do so. The applicant must be graduating from grade 12 and, while high academic standing is not the emphasis, an average of 65% or above is expected. It is of primary importance to demonstrate that at least 20 of the 110 hours expected for the volunteer credit be spent in activities deemed for special needs. These hours can be accumulated outside the school or within the school by seeking opportunities that aid the Resource Department in tutoring those who need it.

Applicants are encouraged to write a 300 word submission that accurately describes the applicant's eligibility for this award in meeting all the above criteria as well as a brief explanation as to why (s)he wants to attend the Leadership and Management course at Springs College. The successful applicant is to be chosen by the donors.

20. Governor General's Academic Medal 2016 (selected by school staff)

This medal "the Bronze Medal" is automatically sent to the school by the Governor General's office. It is to be awarded to the student who graduates with the highest academic standing-a mark of academic excellent.

It is to be noted that the Gov. General's Silver Medal is awarded at each university for their top undergraduate (3/4 year degree) and the Gov. General's Gold Medal is offered by each university for their top post-graduate student. (It is to be noted that Trevor Rempel won the Bronze at Calvin and then the Silver at U of M.)
